

## DAVID : Lesson 113:

The prophet, Samuel, anointed David to become Israel's second king when David was about fourteen years old. It wasn't until David was thirty, that he became king of one tribe, his own tribe of Judah. Seven and one half years later, David finally became king of the entire nation. He began his reign with power and God's blessings. He easily defeated the Jebusites and made Jerusalem Israel's capital. He brought The Ark of The Covenant to Jerusalem. He defeated all of the enemy nations around Israel and enlarged Israel's boundaries. He wrote many beautiful psalms. He also desired to build a house for God. Although God said no, He gave David the promise of an everlasting house, culminating in Messiah Jesus. This promise is known as The Davidic Covenant. It is unconditional and everlasting. Scripture is not always written in chronological order, therefore we cannot be absolutely certain when the events discussed in today's lesson occurred. We begin today in 2 Samuel 21.
