Lesson 14: Dinah's brothers were understandably angry about her attack. Then anger built because Jacob refused to act as the leader of the family. Jacob stood by silently as the boys explained their demands to King Hamor and Prince Shechem. If they, along with all of the men of Shechem, were circumcised, then Prince Shechem could marry Dinah. Also, intermarriage between Jacob's family and other Hivites would occur as well as trade. The Shechemites agreed to the demands. Simeon and Levi then killed every man in Shechem, including the king and prince. Following that, they captured all the wives, children and wealth of Shechem.
